## **Bi-Peds request taken under advisement by the Board of Selectmen**

There was a great show of support on January 18th when the Bi-Peds asked the Board of Selectmen to request a lease on the Newburyport Branch rail right of way. Our wish to fill the meeting room with supporters was granted. The lease would be a 99 years lease for basically no cost to the town. It is the first step required before funding can be applied for to construct a recreational pathway on it. If we had planned who was to speak at the meeting, it could not have gone as well as just letting who ever felt they wanted to contribute get up and do so. Everyone spoke on a different aspect and spoke well. When Catherine Franklin got up and asked to introduce her 9 year old son who wished to speak, it was a great conclusion. Thanks to everyone who attended on that cold night.

And what was the outcome? As of this writing, the latest word from town hall on March 24th was "Town Counsel is currently reviewing MBTA leasing rights. We can't give you anything more definitive until we have some word from his office. We will advise as soon as that happens."

And so we wait but we urge all of you not to wait quietly. Get your pens out and write letters. Keep them short. Just let people know why you feel a rail trail would be a benefit to the quality of life in Danvers

## The year in review:

Last February the Danvers Bi-Peds sent information to abutters of some of the abandoned rail beds in town in an attempt to gauge their opinions on rail trails in town. It was a start but only 11% cared enough to send back the stamped self addressed postcard. We appreciated the replies we did get and were pleased to see a large majority thought favorably about the idea.

The Bi-Peds had a table at Endicott Park day last June telling more citizens about the goals of the group. A video, **A Walk on the Powow Riverwalk**, was produced with the help of Larry Tormey working through the DCAT studio. To make it, Debra Carey of the Amesbury planing office spent a considerable amount of time telling us about their trail. The video appeared many times on the Danvers Cable Network. Anyone who has not seen it and is interested in watching it, can contact Ingrid Barry.

In an effort to make our town sidewalks safer for the disabled and even the able bodied, we were asked by the Disability Committee to help them by reporting bad sidewalk situations. A few of you did reply and those replies were sent on to the proper person. This is an on going project. Do not expect to see results soon but gradually, over the years, hopefully things will improve.

The issue of safety at the Wenham/ Locust Street intersection was brought to the attention of David Lane, Operations Manager of the DPW. Nothing on that front yet either. On January 18th, the Bi-Peds were on the agenda of the Board of Selectmen to ask them to begin negotiations with the MBTA for a lease on the Newburyport Rail Branch. They took it under advisement. On the fun side, several members participated in the Lobster Roll Ride on September 12 led by Steve Winslow of Bike To the Sea. Our own Bob Farley led a group on a 10 mile history ride around town on September 26 as part of Essex National Heritage Commissions Trails and Sails week end. Both events enjoyed great weather.

The Bi-Peds have moved forward on the business end. Our brochure was redesigned by Raphael Brickman, Alison Bruenjes set up our web site and it is being maintained by Eileen McClelland. 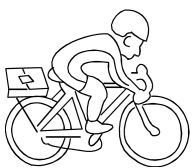
As the Danvers Bi-Peds enters it's fourth year, it is hoped that more meaningful things will begin to happen but it will take the support of many people. Change does not come easily.
